INVITATION – PROPOSAL WRITING WORKSHOP

The Mekong Wetland Biodiversity Conservation and Sustainable Use Programme (MWBP)* aims to strengthen institutional capacity at regional, national and local levels for wetland biodiversity conservation and sustainable use in the Lower Mekong Basin. With financial support from IUCN Netherlands, MWBP will be hosting a proposal writing workshop in Vientiane from 14-18 August 2006.

The workshop is open to persons from local government and civil society organisations working with wetlands and related issues. It is expected that by the end of the project, at least five proposals from Laos are put forward to donors. Additionally, this project will provide first-hand experiences to those trained in proposal writing, with the trained persons providing feedback to their colleagues after the workshop.

Objectives

The objectives of the Proposal Writing Workshop are to:

- Produce up to five project proposals that can be submitted to potential donors.
- Improve the capacity of participants to plan and prepare funding proposals to address wetlands issues.
- Provide participants with knowledge and skills for writing project proposals for submission to donors.
